FREE Yard Waste Facility

Morrow County Recycling offers a facility for yard waste for RESIDENTS of the DKMM District (Delaware, Knox, Marion, and Morrow Counties). It is located off of Township Road 127 or Loren Road and is behind the water treatment plant.

Hours: Open Year Round (Weather Permitting)

Acceptable Items:

Christmas trees without decorations Tree limbs under 10" in diameter. Brush, Shrubs, Leaves and Grass Clippings.

Unacceptable Items:

Tree limbs over 10" in diameter. Tree trunk roots Treated timbers and wood of any kind Straw and Sod

No food, animal or barn waste, or household trash.

Violators will be prosecuted.

Since 2009, over 473 groups have helped to keep Morrow County beautiful by picking up trash along township roads, parks, and community gathering places. More than 4,288 miles have been cleaned with an average of 4 tons of trash and recyclables collected per year for proper disposal. Many of those groups are 4-H clubs. These clubs dedicate themselves year after year to cleaning up our community. In return, youth learn about the importance of community service work. They learn about recycling ma-

terials verses trash, and in the past, these groups earned a little stipend for their weekly stay at the Morrow County Fair. However, budget cuts put a limit on rewarding our youth for their contributions.
