Trash Bash Litter Pick up 2024 and The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency



Keeping Morrow County Beautiful is synonymous with the county's logo: Love life. Live rural. When community service work/volunteering benefits the county, we all benefit. A rural landscape lacking litter attracts beauty, but when a rural landscape contains litter, it attacks more litter.

This year the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency approved of a \$20,557 grant to help fund the Trash Bash 2024 Total Solar Eclipse Litter Pick-up. The benefits of the grant extend to the many volunteers who will participate in picking up litter from our community's public spaces, county and township roads. In addition, litter pickups are being scheduled at Morrow County Fairgrounds, Mt. Gilead State Park and other venues.

The grant will offer not only supplies and services for tackling the litter that may be deposited throughout the April 8th event, but souvenirs and litter kits for the first 400 participants participating in Trash Bash 2024. Being a volunteer can provide a sense of accomplishment and self-fulfillment because it is a selfless action that benefits many. Picking up litter leaves a path of community pride and a pleasing landscape, which

FREE Yard Waste Facility

Morrow County Recycling offers a facility for yard waste for RESIDENTS of the DKMM District (Delaware, Knox, Marion, and Morrow Counties). It is located off of Township Road 127 or Loren Road and is behind the water treatment plant.

Hours: Open Year Round (Weather Permitting)

Acceptable Items:

Tree limbs under 10" in diameter.

Brush, Shrubs, Leaves and Grass Clippings.

Unacceptable Items:

No food, animal or barn waste, or household trash. No tree limbs over 10" in diameter, No tree trunk roots, treated timbers and no wood of any kind. No Straw and Sod.

Violators will be prosecuted.

Additional Residential Services



Household Hazardous Waste

The DKMM District (Delaware, Knox, Morrow, and Marion Counties) now offers 2 semi-permanent collection sites for residents for household hazardous wastes. Appointments must be made between April and September. Proof of residency is necessary and please be aware that the containers fluids are stored in will not be returned.

Appointments for either the Knox County or the Delaware collection sites are on selected Wednesdays. Please call 419-751-2290 to schedule an appointment. A disposal fee of \$1.00 per pound is required. For more information, c h e c k o u t t h e w e b s i t e https://dkmm.org/hazardous-waste

Electronics Collection Sites

Morrow County offers a semi-permanent electronics collection site for residents, April through November 15 (weather permitting). Appointments vary. Please call 419-946-6400 to schedule an appointment for properly recycling your old lamps, vacuums, leaf blowers, printers, microwaves, computers and accessories and just about anything with a cord that does not contain fluids! TV's and all old CRT computer monitors cost only \$20 for disposal.

In April, Cardington-Lincoln Public Library collects electronics from Morrow County residents. Costs vary for TV's. No appointment is necessary. For information, call 419-864-8181

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

Adhesives- roof tar and driveway sealers

Automotive Fluids- antifreeze, motor oil, gasoline, brake fluid, etc. **Batteries**- alkaline, Ni-Cad, lithium, rechargeable, lead acid

All batteries must have ends taped.

All materials \$1.00 / pound disposal fee

Fire Extinguishers

Fluorescent Bulbs

Household Chemicals- pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, insecticides, etc.

Mercury and Mercury Containing Items

Paint and Paint Related Materials- aerosol, latex, oil based paint, varnish

sealers, primers, thinners, turpentine, stains etc.

Propane Cylinders- 20 pounds and under

Smoke Alarms- only if it contains a radioactive symbol

If you are a resident of Delaware, Knox, Morrow or Marion County, bring proof of residency/photo ID, up to 10 cans of paint and \$2.00 per can. Only cans with latex paint will be accepted.
